Purpose of the Survey cont.

▶ Improve

- ▶ Use comments and suggestions to:
 - ▶ Increase attendance
 - Cultivate important key features as identified by members
 - ▶ Identify new topics to be discussed during meetings
 - ▶ Make recommendations for adjusting meeting format
 - ▶ Strengthen the Coalition overall

Creation of the Survey

- ► Free version of SurveyMonkey
 - ▶ 10 questions
 - ▶ Multiple choice
 - ▶ Rating scales
 - ▶ Open-ended

Results

Number of participants: 31

Q1: Are you a member of the Services to Seniors Coalition?

- ▶ 26 individuals (84%) were members
 - ► Two (6%) were not
- Membership for 39% (12 people) was ≤ 5 years
 - Five members (16%) had participated for over 10 years
- ► Interesting findings:
 - ▶ Is the process of becoming a member difficult or unclear?

Q2: Do you see yourself being a long-term member of the Coalition?

- ▶ Only six people (19%) said no
- Some reasons for long-term membership:
 - "I learn a lot regarding seniors' issues and what's out there to solve problems!"
 - "I like to keep up on all new services as they come along."
 - "There is a tremendous need for us to find synergies and creative ways to support the needs of seniors in our community"

Q3: If you have not attended a Coalition meeting before, or have missed a meeting in the past, please indicate why.

- Prior commitments to work (48%)
 - "When you are a very small organization, unexpected work issues mean you need to stay to deal with those – rather than attend Coalition [meetings]"
- Scheduled time was inconvenient (36%)
 - "Tuesday afternoon is a very difficult time for me to attend."
- Scheduled date was inconvenient (28%)

Q4: In your opinion, what are some of he most valuable key features of the Coalition?

- ▶ Information sharing (94%)
- ▶ Networking (81%)
- Working together on common themes and interests (81%)
- ► Collaboration (74%)
- Education opportunity ((61%)
- Social Event (16%)

Q5: Please indicate at least one (1) example of how the Coalition has been useful and how it has not been useful.

- Useful
 - ▶ Information sharing, education, and networking
 - ▶ "Opportunity to learn about supports available"
 - Collaborating and learning what other groups/individuals are doing in the community
 - Presentations
 - "Deepen understanding of community projects"
 - "Give us greater awareness of what is going on"
 - ► Interesting finding:
 - "Not duplicating services, addressing gaps/trends together"

Q5: Please indicate at least one (1) example of how the Coalition has been useful and how it has not been useful. (cont.)

- Not useful
 - ▶ Relevance
 - "Some presentations are not a topic that is relevant to me"
 - ▶ Time management
 - "Sometimes wastes time with some people monopolizing time and going off on tangents"
 - ► Instead of "introducing ourselves each time, just introduce the new person[s]; let us network"

Q6: How would you rate the quality of presentations during the Coalition meetings?

- ► Good (48%)
- ► Excellent (41%)
- ► Satisfactory (10%)

Q7: What are some topics that should be discussed at future meetings?

- "Creating long-term [action] plans"
 - ▶ Pedestrian zones, washrooms, care centres, etc.
- Advocacy/lobbying MP's, MLA's, and Council
 - ▶ Funding
 - Meaningful change
- Improving pre-existing services and supports
- Guaranteed Income Supplement & Old Age Security programs
- Organizational growth
 - ▶ Fundraising tips, financial advice, and I&R Training

Q8: How convenient are the Coalition meeting places for you and/or others in your organization?

- At least somewhat convenient (48%)
- At least somewhat inconvenient (32%)
- New Delbrook Recreation Centre
 - ► Equally convenient (64%)
 - ▶ Less convenient (18%)
 - ► More convenient (9%)
- ▶ Interesting finding:
 - "Collaborative approach to hosting meetings at various Coalition member sites"

Q9: On a scale 1-10, how would you rate the effectiveness of the Services to Seniors Coalition?

- ▶ At least somewhat effective (80%)
- Somewhat ineffective (13%)
- ▶ How do we improve?

Q10: What could be done to improve or strengthen the Coalition, in your opinion?

- "Provide more than just information sharing"
 - Annual/quarterly work plans
- Inform the community about topics/themes/actions discussed
 - Lionsview website/Social Media
- "Increase time for networking and information sharing"
 - Reduce length of presentations
 - ▶ Lunch socials
- ▶ Increase collaborations
- ► Encourage new members to join

Interesting findings and recommendation summary

- Is the process of becoming a Coalition member difficult or unclear?
- Increase attendance
 - More diverse topics and presenters
- Members value networking above all
 - Encourage more interdisciplinary collaborations
- Keep lines of communication open
 - Reduce gaps and duplication of services
 - ▶ More effective and efficient care and supports
- ▶ Improve time management during meetings

Interesting findings and recommendation summary (cont.)

- Take a goal-orientated position
 - ▶ Focus on concrete issues in healthcare and the community
 - Create long term action plans
 - Advocate/lobby government to complete
- Presenters/information aimed at improving member organizations
 - Help inform clients of available services and supports
 - ► Government financial assistance
 - ▶ Fundraising advice, financial advice, and I & R training
- Collaborative approach to housing Coalition meetings

Interesting findings and recommendation summary (cont.)

- Brainstorm and plan meeting topics
 - Presenters related to the topic of the day <u>only</u>
 - ▶ Increase understanding
 - ▶ Potential collaborations
- Lunch socials
 - ▶ Increase networking
 - ► Tight-knit community
 - Increase participation/collaboration
- "Pool resources for service delivery"
 - Address overlap/gaps in services

Interesting findings and recommendation summary (cont.)

- "Advocate as a group for increased funding for non-profits"
- Conduct public outreach as a group
 - Make issues and the Coalition more visible
 - Identify potential new members
- "Health service business [should be] excluded"
 - ▶ Pros/cons?
 - Own agendas
 - ▶ Encourage collaboration with those who can make a difference
