Meet with two North Shore MLA's Bowinn Ma and Susie Chant BC Government Budget 2022 - The conversation focused on a couple of highlights.

- Climate Change and Preparedness- BC has experienced extreme weather events due to Climate Change.
 Hundreds of people lost their lives due to the Heat Dome last summer. Many of these people lived on the North Shore.
- Transportation How can we move goods/services and people, to meet climate targets? This morning, The Mayor's Council presented vision and solutions for the North Shore, includes rapid transit. Next steps – public consultation process. Go to gov.bc.ca

Capital Investments –

Province is investing heavily in:

Affordable Child Care spaces – 1100 new spaces

Social Housing – Plans for 1000 social housing unit

362 Beds for Students

Education infrastructure – Handsworth and

Mountainside have recently completed seismic changes.

LionsGate Hospital has completed recent facility addition.

• **Health** – During the pandemic there has been a lens on Health. "It is now time to make things better".

Changes that are underway:

Hospital and Care Facility maintenance and dietary staff will be moved away from private contracts, back to VCH establishing more public accountability. Staff will only work in single sites (minimizing opportunities for transference of infection.)

There are 600 Nursing positions have been created to meet the current shortage.

Housing – Increasing housing stock that will be made available for vulnerable citizens in the communities (people struggling with mental health disorders, homelessness, and addictions. Goal is to create a system that houses people in safe places.
 On the North Shore we have Whitely Court completion that will be offering seniors affordable housing. Kiwanis will open this fall. There will be 20% units offered by BC Housing - \$375/mo, 50% of units offered at 30% of one's gross income and 35% of the units will be tenanted by Kiwanis management. Seniors are encouraged to go back into BC housing application process to include this new housing option.

- Question "Will the provincial Government provide support for displaced Ukrainians"?
 For information on the BC Government plan: gov.bc.ca/welcoming Ukraine and at BC 211. Provincial government will fill in the gaps from Federal Gov. process.
 Federal Government has a system in place for fast tracking Ukrainians into Canada.
- Veronica Traille –Hollyburn Family Services Outreach Case Worker
 There is a current challenge housing homeless. These are the people that are currently living in shelters and require more support to be offered in long term care and assisted living facilities.

Response by Susie. There is currently a shortage of these supportive housing options because of the closure and relocation of residents from West Van Care Centre to Cross Creek Care Centre. There has also been the unexpected closure of Capilano Care Centre. Where are these people be place? Urgent need for housing stock. Underway is a Housing Needs Assessment? For more information go to Municipal websites.

Challenge – Bowinn - The impact of toxic housing supply: Spec homes/ money laundering and empty homes has been a priority of BC Gov.

Supply and Demand -2021-100,000 new residents came to BC. Gov is working to fast-track mixed use of housing. Other housing options are being looked at: Shared housing and \$ for housing.
