Seniors One Stop – This is a referral program that supporting North Shore. Available by phone, drop-in and provides an updated NS Seniors Directory. Community volunteers with experience and knowledge of North Shore Community provide this important support.

Support is provided for form filling. There is an available computer for community access.

Community Connector - Social Prescribing

Barb provides one on one support for seniors requiring support and advocacy.

This work is done in partnership with other Seniors Service Agencies on the North Shore.

NS Better at Home Program-Judy Stott

Funding provided by the United Way. As the # of seniors increases, more funding will be required to provide this service effectively.

The program provides support to help seniors remain independent.

Some services are provided free of charge, others are charged on a "sliding scale" basis. Services include:

Light Housekeeping – Currently a waitlist available

Minor house repairs

Light yard work

Friendly phone check in

Transportation to and from medical appointments.

3) NSNH- Peer Support Program – Lorna Harding

The NSNH peer support program is available for volunteers and seniors that are 55plus.

The program is part of the Provincial Regional Peer Support Group of B.C.

This is a free service of one-on-one support.

The program currently has 25 active volunteers providing support with an additional 35 on a list (vacation etc).

Volunteers must complete the intensive 50+hr training program. They are always

looking for seniors that are interested in making a difference in someone else's life.

The program provides connections, opportunities to share, friendship and especially to have some fun.

Referrals to the program come from: VCH Older Adult Mental Health team, Lions Gate Hospital, family and friends and self-referrals (often word of mouth).

The program operates out of the John Braithwaite Community Centre. Other support programs includes: Mind and Body Program and Knitting Social

4) Parkgate - Social Prescribing – Angela Sealy, Community Connector and Kate Layard, UBC Social Work Student

The United Way Social Prescribing program operates out of the Parkgate Community Centre. Medical personnel in the community can prescribe that their patient or client participates in this connection/ navigation program. Evidence shows that social connectivity enhances wellbeing resulting in better health outcomes.

There are currently 20 members in the program, with all of them residing across the whole of the North Shore.

Angela and Kate will connect with appropriate community agencies that will best support their clients. Staff will then provide first day support as they join in their neighborhood activities, meeting old and new friends and minimizing the barrier of transportation.
